**Memorandum on Academic Exchange
between**

**The University of Michigan Medical School and School of Medicine Comenius University in
Bratislava**

This Memorandum sets forth the terms and conditions for an exchange of faculty, residents and/or students between The University of Michigan School of Medicine (UMMS) and Comenius University Faculty of Medicine (CUFM).

Article 1. Nomination of Candidates

- A. CUFM and UMMS will nominate respective faculty, residents, and/or students for exchanges contingent on approval of the other institution. The maximum total number of exchange visitors per year will be three.
- B. For full participation in clinical education, medical student candidates must meet the admission requirements of the host university, including prerequisite rotations, examinations, and must demonstrate English proficiency.
- C. For "observer" status, medical student candidates must have completed core clinical rotations in internal medicine, surgery, obstetrics/gynecology, and pediatrics.
- D. Rotations for students at the host institution will be on a space-available basis.
- E. Resident and faculty exchanges must meet requirements of the appropriate department at the host university. Resident and faculty exchanges must be approved at a department level.
- F. Periods and time of exchange can be organized to suit the convenience of the participating institutions, with a four-week minimum duration and a twelve-week maximum duration for students.
- G. All participants in the exchange (faculty, residents or students) must meet the immunization requirements of the host institution regardless of their level of participation.

Article 2. Responsibilities of the Parties

- A. For faculty exchanges, travel, accommodations and other accrued expenses will be covered by the home institution of the respective faculty and/or staff.
- B. Resident and student exchanges do not entitle participants to enter into a degree program at the host institution. Tuition will not be accepted by the host institution. Travel, accommodation, and other accrued expenses will be covered by the student or resident.
- C. The home institution shall ensure that visiting students, faculty and residents carry adequate health insurance to cover the duration of time during the exchange period at the host institution.
- D. Students will be expected to fully participate in all aspects of student life at the host institution.
- E. The host university will identify a single individual to assist visiting students, faculty and residents, scientists in arranging affordable convenient housing, facilitating travel arrangements, coordinating study, and collecting and transmitting grades to the home institution.
- F. An evaluation of visiting student performance will be provided to the home institution within one week of completion of rotations.
- G. The granting and calculation of academic credit for work or study done by exchange visitors at the host institution will be determined by the home institution.

Article 3. Nondiscrimination Clause

- A. Neither institution shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students that would violate the principles of nondiscrimination.
- B. Qualified individuals will be selected regardless of race, sex, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, age, marital status, sexual orientation, disability, height or weight.

Article 4. Financial Consideration

This Memorandum shall not bind either party to a financial agreement.

Article 5.

The agreement shall become effective for 3 years beginning on the date of signatures by the appropriate representatives of both institutions, at which time it will be reviewed for possible renewal for an additional specified period.

Article 6.

This agreement is executed in duplicate, both in English versions, both of which shall be deemed as originals.




